


Sharing the Beauty of our Community



Music is Alive in Elkford

Although Home Routes concerts have been scarce for the past three years due to the pandemic and organizational woes, Elkford music fans have recently been able to enjoy live music with some local talent. Mel's Kitchen celebrated St. Patrick's Day with some in-house entertainment, and then on April 2nd a close-to-capacity crowd enjoyed live music at the Mountain Meadows clubhouse featuring the same musicians. These three men are not strangers to the Elkford music scene, but by coming together they have created a cohesive, pleasing sound and deserve some fanfare.

They appeared at the Mountain Meadows event as The Mike Leduc Trio but they are contemplating a name of their own choosing. The trio consists of three long time Elkford residents, Mike Leduc, Bill MacDonald, and Collin Vandersteen.

Mike Leduc grew up in Elkford and taught himself to play the guitar after being inspired by Nirvana and other grunge bands in the 90's. He also credits time spent jamming with local musicians to develop his talents. He is the lead vocalist of the group as well as a proficient guitarist. His tenor/baritone voice lends itself to convincingly cover musicians from multiple decades.

Bill MacDonald is a talented musician in his own right and is well known for his versatile guitar playing and rock blues sound. He plays lead guitar for the trio and contributes back vocals to the group.

To round up the trio, Collin Vandersteen provides percussion by tapping on a beat box drum, or cajon with his hands. He has been playing this instrument for about a decade and has learned to manipulate it to produce various sounds. This rectangular wooden box has snare gears and by slapping or tapping different parts of the box, drum sounds are created. This instrument works well in smaller venues.

The audience at the Mountain Meadows concert were treated to two hours of fabulous acoustic sets of music originally recorded by artists including: Eric Clapton, Blind Melon, Van Morrison, Radiohead, and others. Both Mike and Bill also have some original tunes which could be included in a future playlist. The majority middle-aged audience showed their enjoyment by toe-tapping, clapping, and singing along. Some even found some floor space for dancing!

What is next for this terrific trio? They will be participating in an event on Mother's Day at the Union Hall in Elkford where the Elkford Lions Club is hosting a charity event. Various musicians will provide entertainment throughout the afternoon and evening. If you are already a fan of Mike, Bill, and Collin or you have not heard them yet, this will be the place to be on May 14th.

Something else to look forward to – the date has been set for the last Home Routes concert for the season at Mountain Meadows. It will be Tuesday May 23rd! Mark your calendar!

Hello Elkfordians!

As winter becomes spring, and we all head outside, here is an important safety reminder for you: please learn to walk facing traffic (except where there are sidewalks). It's much safer to be aware of what is coming toward you.

Downtown Core Utilities Project and Paving

Mayor and council have approved a contract for the final major paving and underground services project for the next while (let's hope 20+ years?). That's right: Alpine Way, from Fording Drive to the 'Red Light' district as well as Fording Drive and Boivin Road will be a massive construction zone all summer long.

Factor in the anticipated construction of the Seniors' Housing Facility this summer - a project of the Elkford Housing Society - on Alpine Way, and you can expect an ACTIVE CONSTRUCTION ZONE. All summer.

Detours will be in place. So, if you are in a hurry, if you are impatient, and if you can't cope with traffic

delays and rough roads, I recommend that you find another way to get where you want to go.

Congratulations to our Citizen of the Year

I'd also like to share a personal shout-out to Steve Wood, our 2023 Citizen of the Year. You'll likely see him cleaning up the ditches along Highway 43. Speaking of which... stop littering!

Further Downtown Revitalization Thoughts

On the topic of downtown revitalization, I've discovered various sources about how this topic has been an exciting issue since 1979. Check out my full 'musings' on the DoE website below. Will Elkford be a growing population with social destinations like cafés, restaurants, and an up-market pub? Micro and pop-up shops? The development of Elkford as a recreational destination? The experts say that we have a municipal government in place that is facilitating ease of development, but what is lacking is 'the first' developer and a visionary entrepreneurial class.

Solid Waste

Rules, rules and more rules! All beyond our control. Recycle BC says no commercial recycling. Well, they've also said that this too could change for compostable products (restaurant and produce).

Yellow bins: the <u>cost</u> to us through the RDEK for haulage of yellow bins will reach \$500/tonne by 2024. This is up from \$340/tonne due to poor market conditions, storage, and fuel costs. We pay less for solid waste haulage! We get <u>paid</u> approximately \$150/tonne for the materials coming out of the recycling depot at the Elkford Transfer Station, so remember to recycle what you can through the depot.

Slash Piles

Our fire department—the paid-on-call fire fighters—are continuing to deal with the 1,000+ slash piles remaining from the 'interface fire treatment' programs of the last few years. Having our folks deal with them ensures that we'll get the remaining grant funding for wildfire prevention, AND that we'll keep more of those dollars in town!

Advocacy

Staff and your mayor are continuing to knock on doors and host meetings with some fairly interested developers. Not only residential developers either... we've received inquiries from a few 'light industrial' companies looking for new locations for their businesses. Diversification does mean some changes, as does population growth. Where does the balance lie? Enjoy the sunshine and start of springtime, folks!

The RAGG was published from 1980 to 1983 every second Thursday by Alan Elford. A year's subscription cost \$7.25. Other papers from our early community days were The Hooterville Squeak, The Elkford Bugle, and The Elk Valley Miner.

Another No Left Turn

At the request of Mike Hora of 512 Elk Street, Council decided to prohibit left turns from Alpine Way onto Elk Street, just as they previously did for turns onto Fording Drive.

The problem developed because of Council's decision to stop cars from turning left from Alpine Way onto Fording Drive. The corner there was becoming dangerous because of cars polishing the ice while trying to stop coming down that steep hill. Unfortunately for the residents of Elk Street, traffic which would have turned onto Fording Drive now went the extra block before making their turn.

In pleading his case, Mike indicated in a letter that the residents of Elk Street have witnessed, with a growing concern for the welfare of their children, the deterioration of safety they previously enjoyed on their street. Mike Hora suggests that people should be using Boivin Road or the Highway as their routes to the mall.

He wrote, "The alternate routes are both designed for the higher traffic loads that Elk Street alone is now bearing. The Boivin Road access has curb and gutter and adequate night illumination, Elk Street has neither.

Council members noted, in making the decision to restrict access, that this was a narrow residential street. and was not planned to be a major arterial road.

Random Thoughts from Father David

of St. Bernard's Catholic Church

My Mum and Dad got married just as the Second World War broke out. Dad was in the army and was based near London, so Mum also stayed in London for the duration of the war. They hardly ever talked about those days, but what was clear was that after the war there was a big change in the society; new values and new appreciations came to the fore, like universal health care, a changed role for women and much more — these were big changes.

We haven't been through a war, but Covid-19 was a really significant event in the life of our society. Certainly since the war we have not known anything like the restrictions and changes that came about because of Covid-19. And while our experience of Covid-19 is quite minor compared with those living in Europe during the last war, Covid did bring real suffering, and not just by those who were ill with the virus. During recent Christmases I remember so many grandparents saying, "forget any sort of present, all I want is a hug from my grandkids." The people who felt alone and isolated, as well as people who had close relatives, or even good friends, and were not able to be there for them - all of these had a real experience of suffering.

So I am left wondering how we as a society have changed after Covid-19, what we have learnt, what values we now see more clearly. I had hoped that we would recognise how much we need each other, and the importance of both the 'essential services' and so many other services we previously didn't recognise as 'essential' – *like those who stack our supermarket shelves*.

Societal change is not easy to bring about, and sometimes smaller changes aren't easy to see, so I am just mulling over in my head how, post-Covid-19, I myself have changed. Having been through this really odd time I wonder what I now value more, and if I might be a better me.


