





Yet, it had breathtaking views, a monstrous rock cliff, and the students felt a true sense of accomplishment once reaching the summit. Students had to dig deep to motivate themselves as well as support others who were struggling.

This was a small group of students, with a lot of strength, grit, and determination. It was pleasure taking them into the mountains, where they relied on themselves and supported one another. Seeing them play in the creeks and balance on the slack line was like seeing them play and have fun with childlike wonder.



Local Active Living and Community Building: Thank You Elk Valley

A big thank you to the communities in the Elk Valley. Elkford Secondary's PE program has been out in the valley exploring the Elk Lakes, picking chicken eggs, climbing Castle Mountain and skiing/snowboarding in Fernie as well as rock climbing in Cranbrook. Students have also been exploring active living activities in their own community, everything from skating and curling to hiking, cross-country skiing, stewardship projects, and survival activities. The program has also been expanding out of the conventional gym activities and into active living programing that is specific to the East Kootenays. Physical education specific to the region is hoped to support a life of active living and community building in the valley and beyond.

This PE program can only be done with local and community support. Everything from rock climbing at Arq Climbing Gym in Cranbrook, skiing and snowboarding at Fernie Alpine Resort and trying a local public gym at Rockhard Fitness in Elkford. These community businesses have all given considerable discounted school rates to make neighboring adventures affordable. Within the school's residing community, the Elkford District (skating/curling/baseball), and Elkford Nordic Society have all allowed students onto their facilities and trails at no cost, further entrenching a sense of affordability and inclusivity for all students in the program. There have also been holistic opportunities for stewardship within the community; the Elkford Trails Alliance, Elkford Nordic Society and the Wapiti ski hill have allowed students to build/maintain trials, stain/paint cabins and clearing brush, truly allowing students an opportunity to connect and build their

community. There have also been other very supportive and generous local groups that have contributed, such as the Elkford Lions Club, the Elkford United Steel Workers, and the Parent Advisory Council. All helping financially for transportation and fees for the many activities that we do. We have also been graciously supported by the Elkford Project Society, Columbia Basin Trust, Elkford Nordic Society and Sparwood Thrift Store, who have contributed financially to the programs' cross-country skis and access to camping equipment.

Thank you to the communities and organizations that have allowed the Elkford Secondary PE program to grow and their support in local, life long, active living activities and community building. Thank you to the students for their resilience and willingness to try. Finally, thank you to the parents that make sure their students are ready for the many adventure's students have succeeded in. Great hustle everyone!

Speeding in Town

One long-standing resident complaint is the number of traffic violations in town, which is being addressed by the local Elk Valley RCMP detachment. Folks may have noticed some RCMP cruisers around town lately. Parked. Occupied. Let's hope that the officers will find Elkfordians to be respectful of the speed limits in and around Elkford. Yes, I know: "but, they're never there when..." that is a reality of life everywhere.

Blast From the Past

More quotes from the November 1981 edition of *The Carbon Copy* (the news magazine of Fording Coal Limited):

"The Village Council is presently reviewing a proposal for a 70-unit full-service motor hotel from a group with experience in operating hotel facilities. The hotel would feature a swimming pool, coffee shop, dining room, poolside lounge, tavern and banquet/meeting facilities . . . sidewalks around the centre will be covered where possible . . . it will all be linked by a pathway called the Devonian Walkway across Boivin Creek . . . the Village of Elkford has approved the purchase of four lots in the town centre. Lots have been sold to McGowen Holdings from West Vancouver to develop two buildings on three lots. Both buildings will be two storeys and contain retail/office/banking space . . . [a] lot has been sold to Karl Maartman Limited from Elkford to build a two-storey office/retail complex."

The more things change...

Sewer Lagoon Smells

Regarding sewer lagoon smells, here is what I gleaned from my conversations with a knowledgeable person:

The reasoning for the additional odour at this time of year is the lagoon doing its annual *flop* when temperatures cause the temperature in sewer to change in gradation from top to bottom. Whenever there is heat or a few sunny days this will also cause additional odour.

Yes, uneven flows can contribute to odour issues, however, all the trucked-in waste only makes up approximately 0.5 per cent of our flow volume. Yes, our work on a new lagoon cell—which is currently underway—will have a long-term positive impact on the health of our lagoon system.

The review of the lagoon system will result in changes that should address at least some of the seasonal odour issues going forward: removing clay in the base of cell 5, aerator repair/replacement (the existing system was turned off for many years and now that we are using it again, it is showing its age) and an improved trucked-liquid waste receiving station. The new cell being constructed will help us perform maintenance in the future, and it also give us a much greater margin of volume to prevent the need for waste discharge into the Elk River.

Grand Opening of Elkford's Childcare Centre

Yeehaw! The child care portion of the new Elkford Childcare Centre and Community Hub had its grand opening, and what a nice facility it is! Hats off to all who had a role and to the various major funders of this project.

Wildfire Season

I'm going to leave you with another reminder that it is fire season. Please honour and follow the fire bans: this is for the benefit of all things great and small.

We've had a few "close calls" over the years. Let's review some of them, shall we?

From the fire high up on the ridge north of the Crossing Creek drainage (anyone remember going to the Look Out to watch it in the evening? Better than the submarine races, eh?), the two fires in 2018 over in the Bull River drainage (we could see the glow and the billowing smoke, and we all had ash fall on our vehicles), the smouldering lighting strike on the ridge, just north of the Weigert Creek forestry road, facing Highway 43 (in a location that was not accessible for fire fighting) to, finally, the fire last summer northwest of Sparwood (that one wasn't a direct threat to us, except for the high risk of smoke leading to the closure of Highway 43). The fire danger in Elkford is not an academic exercise, it is a real and present danger that we all have a role in managing. Get your evacuation kits ready to go now, not later!

As the program reached its conclusion, the swimmers were rewarded with a well-deserved fun day, creating lasting memories. Group challenges and games were organized, adding an element of joy




and excitement to the proceedings. To top it off, the participants were treated to delightful indulgences in the hot tub, a perfect way to unwind and celebrate their achievements.





Physical Education: Teens Experiencing Stewardship and Community Building

On May 26th, Elkford Secondary School PE students headed out for a day on a working adventure. Mr. Gulyas' and Mr. McAlister's grade 8/9 students were given pickaxes, axes, shovels, drills, hammers, and handsaws. They then headed up into Elkford's mountains to support the Elkford Trail Alliance (ETA) in maintaining a portion of Elkford's Trans Canada Trail. This large group of students were broken up into three teams. One group was in charge of clearing the trails of winter falls and spring overgrowth. One group was building a "squeeze gate" (to stop ATV and motorized traffic). The last group was tasked with building trenches to divert water from eroding the trail itself. Students hiked 8.5 km, worked on trails and had an epic lunch in *their* mountains.

This was a day for all the volunteers on site, where they saw students work with an intrinsic motivation to do something good for their community. Many kids had either said, "I have been here before with my family," "I have ridden this before," or "I want to come back and try this section on my bike." Students were connected to the land, to their community and it was evident that it was more then just digging dirt. This connection and determination to help lead to the biggest problem of the day. The planned work projects were not big enough and students completed their task in half the time. Volunteers like Craig Mackinnon, had to scramble and find other sections of trail to improve. Students took what they learned from the initial project and worked even more efficiently and then helped with the decision making. This was all so awesome to see, there was teamwork, communication, positive vibes, and a fundamental willingness to work.



Over the years the PE program at Elkford Secondary School has been going out supporting different active living groups in the community, from the Elkford Nordic Society (staining and painting their cabins) to Wapiti Ski Hill (cutting and clearing brush from the hill). Once a year we try to have students give back and help their community and experience what it means to be a part of a community by supporting local active living groups and societies through stewardship and community building. A big thank you to Collin Standish, Elkford Trails Alliance President, for providing the opportunity to help with this initiative. Collin made sure there was a project, tools for all students, he organized the lunch and provided hats for all the volunteers (ETA's Sponsors: TransCanada trail - Trail Care, Columbia sports wear, Kootenay Market for lunch, District of Elkford and RMR Radiators for tooling). A big thank you to the Elkford Lions Club and the Elkford United Steel Workers for supporting the transportation costs for such local adventures.



2023 Property Tax & Utility Deadline

2023 Property Tax Notices and 2023 Residential Utility Notices were mailed out at the end of May.

To avoid a 10 per cent penalty, all payments must be received by the tax deadline on July 4, 2023. If your financial institution makes your property tax payment, you must still pay your annual Utilities Notice (water, sewer and solid waste) before July 4, 2023. Unpaid utilities are also subject to a 10 per cent penalty.

A reminder that eligible homeowners across B.C. can no longer apply for their home owner grant through their local municipal office, but instead must apply directly to the Province of British Columbia. Eligibility requirements remain the same. To avoid penalties and interest, you MUST apply before the tax due date on July 4, 2023.
