



#### Borrow a Radon Detection Kit from the Library

Radon is the leading cause of lung cancer in Canada and is responsible for as many as 16% of lung cancer deaths.

We have one Corentium Home model radon detector which is about the size of a mobile phone, and has a digital display which produces readings in about an hour. The device needs at least 7 days for highest accuracy. You can borrow it for up to 28 days. The Radon Detection Library Lending Program is provided free through support from Health Canada, the BC Lung Association, Simon Fraser University, and Airthings.

#### **Mayor's Musings**

Happy autumn, Elkfordians! And what a spectacular fall season we've been treated to this year!

#### **One-Year Anniversary**

Your council (Shawna Bryant, Duncan McDonald, Jason Meldrum, Tathlina Lovlin, Len Gostick and Bert Schalekamp) and I have been at work for one full trip around the sun now. This amounts to 25 regular council meetings, about 20 in-camera council meetings, a few Committee-of-the-Whole meetings, one complete cycle of financial planning and strategic planning (both of which are about to start again, by the way), one Association of Kootenay and Boundary Local Governments Annual General Meeting, one Union of BC Municipalities Convention, one Federation of Canadian Municipalities Convention, one Regional District of East Kootenay Regional Governance Forum and one Local Government Leadership Academy Newly Elected Officials' training session. That's a few hours on-task, for sure.

Let me be the first to congratulate Elkford's council on a job well done—collegially and respectfully—while remaining open to new information and different approaches to solving the issues that the District of Elkford faces going forward. Even though we sometimes face contentious issues and very difficult decisions, we can still laugh with each other.

#### Solid Waste

So far in 2023, Elkford is sending fewer tonnes of solid waste to the central landfill than we did last year. To me, this indicates that we are diverting a larger share of our waste into the recycling stream. Keep up the good work everyone!

Hunters, for what it's worth: if you are dumping animal carcasses up some dirt road, remember that you are attracting bears to Elkford. Take the carcasses to the RDEK's Elkford Transfer Station for proper disposal (note that carcasses must be bagged).

#### Bears and Urban Wildlife

Those who don't follow the rules are leading to the potential doubling of solid waste collection costs in Elkford. It's complicated. Supply chain issues are but one component. Commercial bins (those big round black plastic things, the ones that look much like the grass clipping bins, that are supposed to be housed inside wildlife-resistant structures and closed and latched) at all the apartment buildings and businesses in town are one issue. Converting them to steel-lidded bins would require not only all-new bins, but the purchase of a new truck to haul their contents in. That is a massive cost that would be borne by each resident of Elkford. Especially those in apartments and commercial businesses!

Will that fix the problem? I doubt it. At least, not entirely. Individuals would still have to change their behaviour. Garbage put into bins properly; bins secured out of reach of animals (collection days will always present an unavoidable kink in the system) and bins themselves being properly secured when outside (again, impacted by collection day issues).

I send my gratitude to the Urban Wildlife Committee for their efforts to reduce human-wildlife conflict and help us move toward ways to coexist peacefully with wildlife in town.

#### Downtown Core and Infrastructure Upgrades

Have you had a chance to check out the new improvements to our Downtown Core? The complete active transportation network is fantastic! Personally, I've been enjoying the new sidewalks and crosswalks downtown a lot already. My old (circa 1990s) urban bicycle has its winter tires on, and I'm ready for my third winter of bicycling to work, to the post office and to the mall.

Two great benefits of active transportation/bicycling around town are improving your fitness levels and putting less wear on your vehicle as temperatures get lower (okay, well, there's really four benefits there in total if you include enjoying the community and reducing your carbon footprint).

#### Volunteers and Non-profit Societies

Volunteers are the reason why Elkford (and every town in Canada, really) has so many great things for residents to do. To all those who volunteer their time—either a few hours or many hours—your efforts add up. And we thank you! It would be a challenge to list all the many amazing groups and activities (both in and around town) that depend on volunteers to run, but they all share one thing in common: volunteering is not something we can leave for someone else to do. Step up, get involved.

The Environmental Monitoring Committee (EMC) was formed in 2015 following the issue of Permit 107517 that was issued under the Environmental Management Act for Teck's steelmaking coal operations in the Elk Valley. The EMC provides technical advice and Indigenous knowledge to Teck's ongoing monitoring submissions, associated supporting studies and reports required under the Permit. The Committee includes an independent scientist, representatives from the BC Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy, the Ktunaxa Nation Council and Teck.

To those who served on the frontlines of conflict; thank you for bringing us to today.

#### Elkford Secondary School's PE Students Out and About in Their Community

This month there has been a focus on exploring the outdoor Elkford community, from active living activities to finding local sources of nutrition survival as well as giving back to the community.

Mr. Gulyas' PE students have been learning about renewable protein sources at Amanda Culver's farm. The class focussed on chickens and their eggs. Students learned that their families could have chickens in their backyards and the value of farm-fresh eggs over store-bought eggs. Students also saw other animals on the farm that produce food, such as cows, goats and bunnies. Students had the opportunity to pick their eggs and cook them over an open fire.



Students have also been helping in their community. PE students hiked into the local mountains and helped the Elkford Trails Alliance work on the "Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle" trail network. Students started with raw ground, removed the top layer of soil and helped build an awesome new bike trail. Students showed tremendous grit and strength while working together to help build this local trail. Students were able to give back to their community and help support a local active living society through this stewardship and community-building adventure.















It was not all work and nutrition for these students; they were also able to use their local disc golf course and develop their survival skills. Students first began on the open fields at the school and then took their newly developed skills and abilities to their local Deerborne disc golf course. Moving deeper into the woods, students have also been outside, surviving. From building shelters to fires with flint and steel. This year's added challenge has been to build a survival fire "solo" with nothing but flint and steel.



Thank you to Amanda for opening your farm to this boisterous and respectful group. Thank you to the Elkford Trails Alliance for this stewardship opportunity to give back. Thank you to the Lions Club and the Elkford United Steel Workers for your transportation grant that allowed us to get to our farm and work site.



Did you know that the majority of fire fatalities occur in one and two-storey residential family homes? According to the BC Office of the Fire Commissioner, 75 per cent occur in the winter months—all in time of darkness, when address identification is most difficult.

The Elkford Fire Department asks you to take a moment to assess your home for outside address identification. In the event of an emergency, will your home's address be visible to emergency first responders? Is your address clearly marked? Will it be covered in snow or hidden in the darkness? If it is inadequate or in need of repair, please take the time to repair or improve it. It could save your life!
