It will soon be elk rutting season once again. The elk rut typically runs from the beginning of September to mid-October.

Bull elk can become extremely aggressive protecting their harems during the mating season. Keep about 30 metres between you and an elk and never get between a male and females in the area.

Do not park your vehicle between a male and the females; elk may charge your vehicle which may result in damage.

Here are some tips for avoiding and handling an encounter with an elk:

- Travel in a group.
- Watch for elk at all times and detour around them.
- If possible, walk around elk on the high side of a slope or uphill.
- Stay back at least 30 metres.
- Keep your dog on a leash at all times. An unleashed dog may prompt an elk to become
- aggressive as they view the dog as a predator (wolf or coyote).
- Carry pepper spray, a walking stick, or an umbrella as protection.
- Act dominant if an elk gets too close.
- Raise your arms or any big object (jacket or umbrella) to make yourself appear
- larger, maintain eye contact and never turn your back or run. Climb a tree or keep an object, like a tree or large rock, between you and the elk. Back slowly out of the area. Warn other hikers of the elk ahead.
- If you are knocked down or fall, get up and try to move to cover or use an object to protect yourself.
- DO NOT PLAY DEAD.

















Elkford Public Library 2024 Photo Contest

Photo submission deadline: September 28, 2024

We are tapping into our creative juices with this year's theme, "Art in Town." Use your camera's features to snap long exposure shots or show off your photography skills with use of perspective or abstract subjects. We want to see your creativity! Still want to take a candid photo of your eat? That's welcome too—any subject matter or photography style is accepted in the 'open' category.

Photo Contest Rules and Information

- Each person can enter a maximum of three (3) photos. Entrants must specify in which category they are submitting each photo. Photos may be entered in any category, e.g., an entrant may enter three photos in one category, or one photo in each of three categories, etc.
- Photos must be taken in and around the Elkford area, e.g., the Elk Valley or Crowsnest Pass.
- Submitted photos should be printed on 5"×7" photo paper. Photos may optionally be printed at the library for \$2.00 per 5"×7" print.
- One prize will be awarded in each category per age group, for a total of eight prizes.
- Photos must be taken by the person entering them.
- Registration forms are available at the library. You need one form per photo entered. A
 release form must be signed upon entering the contest, allowing the library to use your
 photos.
- We require a high-resolution, digital copy of your photo.
- You may only use computer alteration on one of your submitted photos. In all others, only cropping is allowed. It is permitted to use filters when taking the photos.
- Date stamps must be removed, or your photo will be disqualified. You may erop date stamps from your photos.
- Parents of a minor child who has been photographed must sign a release allowing the photo to be shown in public and on our website.
- · Only amateurs may enter the contest.
- E-mail your photos to info/a]elkfordlibrary.org and drop off your registration forms before the contest deadline.







WATERING RESTRICTIONS STILL IN EFFECT

To ensure capacity of Elkford's reservoirs in the event of a fire emergency (and adequate water for all throughout the drier months) watering between April 1 and September 30 is to take place on odd or even numbered days, corresponding with your address, and within the hours of 7 p.m. and 10 a.m. (long-time Elkford residents may remember different times, but note that the hours were amended within Good Neighbour Bylaw No. 871, 2022) only.

Thank you for following this important bylaw and helping us to conserve water!

REMINDER ABOUT ANIMALS AT-LARGE FROM BYLAW ENFORCEMENT

A friendly reminder from District of Elkford Bylaw Enforcement that Elkford's Animal Responsibility Bylaw prohibits owners from allowing their dogs and cats to roam at-large within municipal boundaries.

The District of Elkford currently has no designated off-leash areas for pets within municipal boundaries, meaning that your pets must always be kept on a leash and under the control of a competent person whenever they are not on your private lands or premises (or otherwise on the private lands/premises of others with their consent). Owners of animals that are deemed to be "at-large" will be issued fines of \$50 (or more) per offence.

Regardless of whether your dog is friendly or not or whether your cat is used to living indoors/outdoors—keeping pets under your control and supervision at all times is important for their safety and wellbeing. This benefits local wildlife, people and other pets in your neighbourhood too!
