












Borrow a Radon Detection Kit from the Library

Radon is the leading cause of lung cancer in Canada and is responsible for as many as 16% of lung cancer deaths.

We have one Corentium Home model radon detector which is about the size of a mobile phone, and has a digital display which produces readings in about an hour. The device needs at least 7 days for highest accuracy. You can borrow it for up to 28 days. The Radon Detection Library Lending Program is provided free through support from Health Canada, the BC Lung Association, Simon Fraser University, and Airthings.



CHECK YOUR CHIMNEYS

2025 BUSINESS & PET LICENCE RENEWALS

It's almost time to renew your business and pet licences Elkford residents who are 60 years and over, for 2025! You can look for your renewal notices in your mailbox in January.

Annual fees for business licences are:

- New OR Annual Renewal for Business Licence: \$100
- New OR Annual Renewal for Youth Business Licence: \$20
- New OR Annual Renewal for an Inter-Community Business Licence (ICBL): \$100 (note that the ICBL fee is in addition to your \$100 fee for your municipal business licence)

The due date for all business licence fees is January 31, 2025

The dog/cat pet licence fee is \$50 annually for an unsterilized licence and \$20 for a spayed/neutered

Are you a new pet owner? You must purchase a licence for your dog or cat. Please bring the certificate of spaying/ neutering for first time registration. The due date for all pet licence fees is February 28, 2025. For pet licences, a late fee of \$20 applies after February 28, 2025.
