




Elkford's Non-Motorizied Trail Network is Growing and Growing

2024 was the biggest year yet for the Elkford Trails Alliance. They kept 20 km of trail groomed all winter, logged well over 2400 volunteer hours and held their first Poker Derby – Ride, Run or Hike. The highlight of the year was celebrating the opening of their first blue flow trail (named Shredder), in July followed by opening "Heroes" in October, a black, hand-built trail also in the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle network. Additionally, they secured a maintenance agreement with the District of Elkford helping ensure all of the non-motorized trails in and around Elkford are kept in tip top shape in exchange for keeping the ETA insured, tooled and supported.

All year long the ETA leads group rides and hikes, as well as offering fun, family-friendly activities at Elkford's Winter in the Wild and Wildcat Days. These are some of the initiatives that lead to being awarded the "Community Group of the Year" at the Elkford Chamber of Commerce Business Awards in October.



You can support the ETA by purchasing a membership,

What's next for 2025? They've got a new trail well underway, having worked hard last fall to build a bridge across Boivin Creek and clear several kilometers of trail in preparation for building a new four-season trail in the Boivin corridor, pending funding. January will bring participation in the Elk Valley Streak, a group snowshoe & fireworks at Winter in the Wild in February, and group fatbike rides & snowshoes all winter long. They are also fundraising for a 2nd winter grooming machine to keep up with their growing trail network.

The Elkford Trails Alliance wishes to thank the Columbia Basin Trust, the District of Elkford, Teck Resources (now Elk Valley Resources), NWP Coal, StellerVista Credit Union, Elk Valley Thrift Store and the Trans Canada Trail for funding their trail projects. Funds alone don't build trails, they have a dedicated Board of Directors that put in countless hours and many generous volunteers that they are eternally grateful for. As well as Doman, for the use of their land, Ram Mountain Power for equipment use, Esso for fuel donations and all the local businesses who donated prizes for the Poker Derby in September... thank you and Happy New Year!







BLEEDER VALVES: ON

A friendly reminder to all residents to turn **ON** the bleeder valves in your residences from **October 31 to May 1**. This important bylaw is in place to prevent your pipes from freezing and cracking in colder temperatures.

KEEP KIDS OFF OF ROADSIDE SNOWBANKS

Every time it snows, Public Works operators work to cut back snow banks and snow piles to widen our roadways. Please ensure that children do not play in snow berms or on snow piles along roads.

Operators don't have x-ray vision: they are unable to see tunnels carved in the snow and cannot always see children who are playing on snow banks. Additionally, tunneling in snow piles is very dangerous in itself, often resulting in fatalities when snow forts collapse.

Please play it safe! Kids (and kids at heart) can always safely toboggan and play in the snow at the toboggan hill that is piled high beside the District Office and running into the soccer field. When dark falls, the hill is lit up for some guintessential winter fun!

2025 BUSINESS & PET LICENCE RENEWALS

It's time to renew your business and pet licences for 2025! Renewal notices were mailed out in January.

Annual fees for business licences are:

- New OR Annual Renewal for Business Licence: \$100
- New OR Annual Renewal for Youth Business Licence: \$20
- New OR Annual Renewal for Inter-Community Business Licence (ICBL): \$100 (note that the ICBL fee is in addition to your \$100 fee for your municipal business licence)

The due date for all business licence fees is January 31, 2025.

The dog/cat pet licence fee is \$50 annually for an unsterilized licence and \$20 for a spayed/ neutered licence.

Are you a new pet owner? You must purchase a licence for your dog or cat. Please bring the certificate of spaying/neutering for first time registration. The due date for all pet licence fees is **February 28, 2025.**
